Washington Conference was February 24-27, 2019, with the tours of the memorials on Sunday February 24. Detachment Commander Alexander, Jonathan Alexander, 1st Vice Bob Manzo, 2nd Vice Mark Fayer, Sally Fayer, PDC JR Hall, Eleanor Deal and I attended. There were 105 members of The American Legion Family from all across the country that attended and laid 31 wreaths around the Washington area memorials. It was truly a great day. I did attend the meetings on Monday and Tuesday. The Legislative agenda for the 116th Congress was published. The top priorities for this year are in a pamphlet on the back table. One in particular which pertains to some of you in this room is Redefine "wartime service" period and it has a Senate Bill S504. This bill would make anyone who was in service from WWI to present to be eligible for membership in The American Legion regardless of wartime status. This could help The American Legion with membership as well as the SAL. The full listing of priorities will explain basics of the priorities. I have a 28 page Point papers which explains each priority in detail which I have sent out to many and if you want a copy of it just send me an e-mail asking for Point papers and I will send it to you. Greetings Fellow Sons,

DMD Mining Operations are still going strong, and the members are flowing into the processing center.

As of this time, the Detachment stands at 91.08% of goal with 14,731 memberships remitted out of a goal of 16,173. We are currently at 83.24% for renewals for the year. The District Mines are hard at work bringing in all that gold and searching for new sources.

The 90% Goal Date of April 10th has come and gone, and we are now working on the May 8th 100% Goal Date. Congratulations to the Squadrons and Districts that have achieved the 90% goals...but let's keep working hard as we can't afford to miss even one gold nugget! Remember our goals are to exceed 16,173 members and achieve 90+% traditional renewals this year.

April 1 was the mailing date for the last renewal notice, now is a good time to call your nonrenewals while the thought is still fresh in their minds. Step up and help your membership chairman to bring in the gold!

The cut-off for award judging is May 31st, that's 8 weeks from now...plenty of time to work those hard to reach nuggets of membership goal. Don't leave a stone unturned...we can do it!

Convention is June 21-23. We will be distributing 2020 membership cards and rosters (if National gets them out in time) at registration. Remember, you must remit your delegate fees and submit your Squadron Certification Forms (both included in the Convention Pack you should have received) to receive your 2020 cards. The formula for computing delegate fees is in the package as well. We will try to make this a seamless process, but it is much easier if you take care of these two items prior to convention.

Finally, you can still submit the forms for National Commander Gibbs member recruitment incentive for 2019. Each member who signs up 3 new members will receive the Commanders Membership Pin. The pin commemorates the 100th Anniversary year. Members who sign up 5 new members will receive the Individual Recruitment Award. This year they are issuing a pin for every 5 members you sign up. Forms are available online and can be downloaded or filled out online. The Blue Brigade is a special award for those who recruit 30 new members. Each recipient is awarded a certificate and a special Blue Brigade jacket.

I have a standing challenge to the District Commanders. I will make a \$100 donation to either the District Commanders Project or to a Children and Youth Project of their choice, to the first District that reaches 100% membership by the May 31, 2019 Cut-Off.

You've been working hard all year but there is still a job to be done, so let's go "Mining for Members!"
