Post Convention DEC: Please be advised that after the adjournment of this convention, a brief meeting of the Detachment Executive Committee will take place immediately on location there at Francis Scott Key Post. The D.E.C. will ratify any new Detachment appointments, the 09-10 budget, new D.E.C. men, and delegates to the National Convention. Districts please be prepared to hand in your newly elected officers, D.E.C. representatives, and National delegates from your district. I will list these criteria for your convenience. Article VII, Section 1 of the Detachment Constitution states: "The Detachment Executive Committee shall consist of ... one (1) Sons of The American Legion member from each District, plus one (1) from each District for every 400 members or major portion thereof, plus the District Commander, which are to be chosen at the respective District Caucus to serve for a period of one (1) year." Article V, Section 3 of the National Constitution states: "... each Detachment shall be entitled to one (1) delegate and one (1) additional delegate for each 500 members or major fraction


thereof..." For both of these criteria please refer to the membership report issued by the Department of Maryland on May 29, 2009 for your district's totals. Typically, not every district submits their total number of allotted delegates for the national convention which will allow for other districts to exceed their allotment, therefore, please list everyone that intends on traveling to the national convention and we will address any surplus if necessary.

Unless your Squadron is just a Squadron on paper, you have performed Community Service at some point during this past year. If your Squadron has helped your Post with any repairs, maintenance, fundraisers, or memorial services, clean-up, etc, then your Squadron has performed Community Service. If any member of your Squadron has volunteered his services to your local Fire Departments, Police Departments, or Rescue Squads, you can claim the hours, they volunteered, as Community Service.

If any of your members have volunteered their services as a coach of any sports leagues, such as youth football, softball, baseball, basketball, wrestling, hockey, etc, your Squadron may claim their hours as Community Service.

If any member has volunteered his services at any school, in your community, whether they were conducting a flag etiquette program, or flag education, or helping as an aide, your Squadron can claim their hours as Community Service.

If your Squadron helped with, or sponsored a Holiday Party at your Post,

the hours and cost can be claimed as Community Service.

There's a lot that your Squadron is doing to serve your communities. You just need to ask yourself this question, if you're not sure. " Does what my Squadron do, help or pertain to my Community? " Make sure that you place this information on your Consolidated Report Form and make sure that you give a copy, of your report, to your Post Commander.

Here are a few more FAQ's that the National Chairmen receive taken from the National Website:

Question: There are speeches that I can use for some of the major Holidays, are they updated on a regular basis.

Answer: Yes they are rewritten to keep the speeches current and relative to today's ever changing information.

Question: May a person, other than a veteran, have their casket draped with the flag of the United States?

Answer: Yes, although this honor is usually reserved for veterans or highly regarded state and national figures, the Flag Code does not prohibit this use.

Question: Who is eligible for the

American Legion Legacy Scholarship?

Answer: Eligibility: Child/Children, or legally adopted child/children, of active duty United States military and Guard, and Reserve personnel who were federalized and died on active duty on or after September 11, 2001. Must be a high school senior or high school graduate to apply for the scholarship. Scholarship is for undergraduate study at a U.S. school of higher education.
