Eligibility

1. Eligibility open to Legionnaires and Sons of The American Legion members (up to \$3,000) Legion Posts (up to \$10,000).

2. Applicant must have been displaced from their primary residence due to a declared natural disaster and provide proof of out-of-pocket expenses. Not meant to replace or repair items, only to meet most immediate needs (i.e., temporary housing, food, water, clothing, diapers, etc.)

3. Does not cover insurance

compensation or monetary losses from a business, structures on your property (barns, tool sheds, etc.,) equipment or vehicles.

Membership must be active at time of disaster and the time of application.

Application requirements

1. Application must be received within 90 days of disaster.

2. Disaster must be a "declared" natural disaster for Legion Family members. -

3. Supporting data (photos, receipts, repair estimates, etc.) should be included if at all possible or statements (testimony) from post/district/ department officers attesting to damages.

4. Only one grant per household.

Post grants must derive from a declared natural disaster and substantiating documentation must provide that The American Legion post will cease to perform the duties and activities in the community due to losses sustained.

CHILDREN & YOUTH CORNER

This article highlights some of our veterans interacting with Maryland school children. The article was taken from the Maryland Special Olympics website.

On October 8, over 80 Baltimore City elementary school students joined Sailors and Marines from the Harpers Ferry-class amphibious dock landing ship USS Oak Hill (LSD 51) and the Freedom-class littoral combat ship USS Milwaukee (LCS 5) for a Special Olympics Young Athletes field day in celebration of this year's Maryland Fleet Week & Air Show in Baltimore.

The pre-k through 2nd graders from Johnston Square Elementary School participated in several sport skill stations at UA House at Fayette where they practiced running, jumping, throwing, striking, kicking, and more. More than 30 volunteers from the U.S. Navy & Marines ran the stations, playing basketball, soccer, and parachute & obstacle games with the students, while teaching basic skills and encouraging a fun, inclusive environment.

U.S. Marine Ethan Lamberth enjoyed volunteering with Special Olympics – something he had done as part of his high school's Junior ROTC program in Tennessee. "We really enjoyed it. It was a good experience to be able to come out here and help these kids and be able to interact with the community a little bit more."

This year's Maryland Fleet Week & Air Show took place from October 3-9 in Baltimore, where more than a dozen naval ships and 2,500 sailors from the U.S., Canada, and the U.K. participated in events stretching from Middle River to the Inner Harbor. Academy midshipmen for its annual Anne Arundel County Spring Games, the October 8 event marked the first time in which Special Olympics Maryland has participated in Fleet Week activities.

Special Olympics Young Athletes is a sport and play program for children with and without intellectual disabilities ages 2 to 7, and is implemented throughout the state in schools, homes, and the community. It provides children with the opportunity to play with others and develop important learning skills like sharing, taking turns, and following directions. It also offers teachers, community members, and caregivers the chance to share the joy of sports with children.

Mackenzie Irvin, Special Olympics Maryland's Young Athletes Program Coordinator, has been working to increase school and community engagement with the program. "We saw what happens when community reaches schools and vice-versa," she said. "The day was a prime example of learning that transcends the classroom and lends a hand to the daily lives of Johnston Square Elementary School students. Students took away lessons on gross motor skills, instilling healthy habits, the importance of being active... but most of all, a smile and a laugh."

The Legislative commission is very important part of The America Legion. The Legislative agenda for the 116th Congress was published.

Here are the top priorities for this year: Redefine "wartime service" period; Support VA's suicideprevention efforts; Implement, oversee new laws; Fully fund a superior national defense; Improve health care for women veterans; Reclassify cannabis for medical research; Programs to end veteran homelessness; Re-employment rights for veterans; Access to business capital via GI Bill; Citizenship for honorable service; Repeal unfair VA offsets; Protect the American flag and Expand Agent Orange benefits.

Learn about one or two items that you are interested in and then contact your representatives and talk to them about those issues. We need to help take care of our Veterans. Get involved, take action, stand up and be counted, fight for our Veterans. I am asking you to contact your senators and congressmen and pass on these priorities.

Delegate Allowance: Article V – Legislative Body

Section 3. -- In the Sons of The American Legion, Detachment of Maryland Convention, each Squadron in good standing with at least ten (10) active members shall be entitled to one (1) delegate and one additional delegate for each additional twenty-five (25) members.

Reminder, that a "Delegate at Large from your Squadron is only a member who is either a; **District Commander**, **Detachment Officer** or a **Past Detachment Commander**.

Also, each squadron is required to pay for their "full delegate fees" in order to receive their "new" membership cards, as well as submit a 20198—2020 Squadron Certification form, which identifies your new officers. "No Exceptions" Membership cards "Will Not" be issued, without a Squadron Cert & Fully Paid Delegate Fees.

The members of this committee responsible for the various events have all the venues locked down and everything is set. I would like to thank each and every one of them for doing such an outstanding job on each of their
