Boys State

The staff and posts get an updated listing by email of applicants for MD Boys State. The online registration of boys for the program as of 13 March 2018 has 128 applications and some with no information. Ask the post to forward this listing to your squadron if you are sponsoring a boy. If you know the name or names of the boy(s) from your area that you have been talking to you can see their status of their application. The online application system is working, and the Department of Maryland Headquarters staff is getting the information about the boys, but that doesn't mean the Posts can just sit back and wait.

Department Headquarters has seen the list grow about 15 a week over the last few weeks. We hope the list continues to grow faster in the coming weeks. Reach out to your contacts at the schools, JROTC, Scouts, SGA, or anywhere these boys can be found. We need more boys to apply to this great program. We are looking to get close to 200 this year, and we need a concerted effort from your squadron and post to get there. For those that don't know there is a deadline of April 15th for the applications to enter their data online. Then the post will meet with the candidates and forward the tuition of \$350.00 per candidate by the May 15th deadline.

Now is the time for the squadron to ask their Post, what can we do to assist in sending a boy (s) to this great program. If your squadron sponsors a boy(s) here are some ideas. Have a fundraiser, a 50/50 raffle, or put out a jar in the Post's lounge with the Post's permission. Also, don't forget you can go out in your community and solicit funds from businesses or alumni of this program to get sponsors for Boys State.

How many squadrons know who their Post's
Chairperson for Boys State is. That person is
usually very knowledgeable about the program a difference.
and you may find out that person is on the

Boys State staff. Also, they are the liaison between the post, schools, and the Boys State Committee.

Remember if you give your Post a donation to sponsor a boy to this great program, please bring a copy of that check to the next Detachment meeting so your squadron gets credit and don't forget to report the amount on your squadron consolidated report.

Remember to earmark your check MD Boys State.

The objective for each Post in the state with the help of their squadron should be to send one boy to this program. If your post or squadron cannot afford the donation do not quit there have the boy send in his application. The committee will find a post or squadron or somebody to sponsor him. National Emergency Fund:

Last year the American Legion National Emergency Fund gave out close to \$370,000 to help Posts and individual Legion family members to recover from devastating natural disasters.

Melbourne Post #81, in Florida, had their roof damaged by Hurricane Irma. The NEF granted their application and help put a new roof on the Post.

Naples, Post #135, also in Florida, had extensive flooding to the extent of 8 to 10 inches of standing water, ending up causing water and mold damage. They also received a grant from the NEF and are rebuilding.

Just think if any of these disasters hit your Post and there was no money in the NEF to help you. It is time to contribute.

Those of you that have, my thanks. Those of you on the fence, now is the time to make a decision. The Detachment of Md. has close to 16,000 members. If each Squadron gave \$1 for every member, we could do a world of good.

As we get to the end of the year let's make a difference

Eligibility

Eligibility open to Legionnaires and Sons of The American Legion members (up to \$3,000) Legion Posts (up to \$10,000).

Applicant must have been displaced from their primary residence due to a declared natural disaster and provide proof of out-of-pocket expenses. Not meant to replace or repair items, only to meet most immediate needs (i.e., temporary housing, food, water, clothing, diapers, etc.)

Does not cover insurance compensation or monetary losses from a business, structures on your property (barns, tool sheds, etc.,) equipment or vehicles.

Membership must be active at time of disaster and the time of application.

Application requirements

Application must be received within 90 days of disaster.

Disaster must be a "declared" natural disaster for Legion Family members.

Supporting data (photos, receipts, repair estimates, etc.) should be included if at all possible or statements (testimony) from post/district/department officers attesting to damages.

Only one grant per household.

Post grants must derive from a declared natural disaster and substantiating documentation must provide that The American Legion post will cease to perform the duties and activities in the community due to losses sustained.

Legislative Alert:

The Washington Conference was February 25-28, 2018. The wreath laying tours on Sunday February 25 were awesome. National Commander Danny Smith laid a wreath at the tomb of The Unknown Solder at Arlington National Cemetery at 9:15 am. He was accompanied by members of the Sons and Legion family members from across the country to lay wreaths at both the Korean War Veterans Memorial and the World War II Memorial. Members of The American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary, Sons of The American Legion, friends and families showing respect for the sacrifices made by our Nation's military in the defense of liberty and freedom. For the first time we had 2 buses for the tours and what a turnout. we had 96 legion family reserve seats on the buses.

I did attend the Legislative meeting on Monday February 26 and the Commanders call on Tuesday. The Legislative agenda was presented and the priorities are as follows: Support VA's suicide prevention efforts; Limit outsourcing, unify VA's programs; Fully fund a superior national defense as the global war on terror continues; Create lifetime electronic health record; Reclassify cannabis for medical research; Institute gender-specific health care for women veterans; Support those who care for wounded veterans; Defend veterans education benefits; Repeal unfair offsets that penalize disabled veterans and widows: Provide mandatory end-of-service exams for reservists; Ensure those returning from active duty retain reemployment rights; Continue funding programs to end veterans homelessness; and Protecting the American Flag. I am asking you to

contact your senators and congressmen and pass on these priorities. I have more detail in a pamphlet and available on the National web site. I have sent email with Priorities and point papers attached. The Legion web site is: https://www.legion.org/legislative/. More information is available at: www.congress.gov. The information is sometimes overwhelming however it is easily accessible and you can find any current legislation. Using the web site above you can look up your representatives and send them e-mails or call them. Schedule a meeting with them and sit down for a few minutes and ask questions about their support for our veterans.

Time and Place Committee

~ 45th Annual Convention ~

We're heading back to Laurel for the 45th Annual Convention!

Each notification within the "Time and Place Committee", which outlines the location, date and times for the convention, are considered "Official Announcements" to all eligible members in good standing within the Detachment of Maryland. Therefore, you have been advised if you are reading this article.

Now with that said, let the planning begin. Each squadron should begin to look at their accomplishments to-date, so they may capture them on their "Consolidated Report Form", along with determining who is attending as a delegate from their squadron.

Delegate Allowance: Article V – Legislative Body Section 3. -- In the Sons of The American Legion, Detachment of Maryland Convention, each Squadron in good standing with at least ten (10) active members shall be entitled to one (1) delegate and one additional delegate for each additional twenty-five (25) members.

Reminder, that a "Delegate at Large from your Squadron is only a member who is either a; **District Commander**, **Elected Detachment Officers** or a **Past Detachment Commander**.

Also, each squadron is required to pay for their "full delegate fees" in order to receive their "new" membership cards, as well as submit a 2018—2019 Squadron Certification form, which identifies your new officers. "No Exceptions" Membership cards "Will Not" be issued, without a Squadron Cert & Fully Paid Delegate Fees.
