late renewals. You know the members who hold off until the spring to pay their dues and now is the time to get them into the ore bucket! Remember, if you aren't paid up to date for 2019 by the end of January you are considered delinquent, don't be delinquent! Your

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squadron needs your dues to help with all the donations and programs they support. National Commander Gibbs will be visiting with us at the January DEC in Ocean City, let's show him how the Maryland Sons get the job done!

As of this time, the following is the current year, membership standings:

- 1-NESD- 74.37% of Goal
- 2-NCD- 65.89% of Goal
- 3-SMD- 64.94% of Goal
- 4-SESD- 64.59% of Goal
- 5-WMD- 69.79% of Goal
- 6-Baltimore- 55.69% of Goal
- 7-MTD- 50.62% of Goal

6 of 7 District Mines achieved the December 12 Goal of 45% of the quota due. I am pleased to say that 5 Districts are already ahead of schedule on the January 17th Goal of 60%.

A reminder, National Commander Gibbs has announced his new member recruitment incentive for 2019. Each member who signs up 3 new members will receive the Commanders Membership Pin. The pin commemorates the 100th Anniversary year and is 24K Gold plated. Members who sign up 5 new members will receive the Individual Recruitment Award. This year they are issuing a pin for every 5 members you sign up. Forms are available online and can be downloaded or filled out online. The Blue Brigade is a special award for those who recruit 30 new members. Each recipient is awarded a certificate and a special Blue Brigade jacket. If you recruit the most members nationwide you can receive special recognition as Recruiter of the Year.

Boys State

Greetings, I hope all of you had a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

Here's the latest from The American Legion, Department of Maryland. As of 27 December 2018, the Boys State program had 49 applications and climbing. As of 30 November, the Department had only 24, so you see the applicants are signing up. The Department didn't have this many application by the end of January 2018. This year it was decided to send the info out to the schools in November and it looks like it has gotten some early results.

The distribution is great as well, so far there are 19 counties out of 24, along with 1 from the District of Columbia. The counties with the most so far are Harford and Montgomery leading the way with 7 and 8 respectively. Continue to work on recruiting the best students in MD for our program.

If the Post Boys State Chairperson would like more contact information, please send a request to boysstate@mdlegion.org. Again, this year there is an orientation packet posted on the website. Posts or the Post Boys State Chairperson can use this to help understand the program and inform the parents/students. PLEASE DO NOT



UNDERSELL THE DEMANDS OF THIS PROGRAM.

Also, a big change to this year's packet is the addition of a financial responsibility for late cancellation form that the parents must download, sign, and then upload to the application. This is due to students cancelling within 30 days of the program for no reason at all and this is unfair to the Posts that sponsor the students. If a student cancels within 30 days and is not for an emergency, then the Department can provide the Post with the form signed by the parents, so the Post can attempt to recoup their tuition if the Post feels it is appropriate.

National Emergency Fund:

Hope everyone had a safe and merry Christmas and a happy New Year. May it continue the whole year.

Some members did not this past year. The National Emergency Fund handed out over \$238,000 to those in need from January to November. This is why it is important to give to the NEF, because you never know when tragedy is going to strike. It could be your neighbor, your Post or even yourself that could be the victim of fire, hurricane, or flood.

So please, as we start this new year, let's give to the NEF. Our goal is \$8000 or approximately 50 cents a member.

Eligibility

1. Eligibility open to Legionnaires and Sons of The American Legion members (up to \$3,000) Legion Posts (up to \$10,000).

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2. Applicant must have been displaced from their primary residence due to a declared natural disaster and provide proof of out-of-pocket expenses. Not meant to replace or repair items, only to meet most immediate needs (i.e., temporary housing, food, water, clothing, diapers, etc.)

3. Does not cover insurance compensation or monetary losses from a business, structures on your property (barns, tool sheds, etc.) equipment or vehicles.

Membership must be active at time of disaster and the time of application.

Application requirements

1. Application must be received within 90 days of disaster.

2. Disaster must be a "declared" natural disaster for Legion Family members. -

3. Supporting data (photos, receipts, repair estimates, etc.) should be included if at all possible or statements (testimony) from post/district/department officers attesting to damages.

4. Only one grant per household.

Post grants must derive from a declared natural disaster and substantiating documentation must provide that The American Legion post will cease to perform the duties and activities in the community due to losses sustained.

Since Jan. 1, 2018, the NEF has provided more than \$166,000 in grants. These grants are made possible by donations to the fund. To donate, visit www.legion.org/donate.
