Convention News: The 40th Annual Convention of the Detachment of Maryland is returning to the Hunt Valley Inn located at 245 Shawan Road, Hunt Valley, Md. 21031. Their phone number is 410-785-7000. As a point of information the Hunt Valley Inn has been purchased by the Wyndham Hotel Group. This year's room rate at the hotel is \$98.00 plus 14% tax per night. Room reservations should be made directly with the hotel by using group code "Sons of The American Legion". **Every Squadron Commander and** Detachment Officer has received a packet containing the Convention, Ad Sales and Report Form Packages along with the Consolidated Report Form, a Laps of Love Sponsor Sheet, The Pride, and a letter from Commander Hill. Please note that the delegate fees have increased this year and should remain unchanged for several years to come. This increase was recommended by the Convention Committee to offset the costs of the rental of meeting facilities which in the past averaged \$5K for the weekend. This increase was approved by the S.A.L. Commission and the Department Executive Committee on February 17th. During these tough economic times Convention Hotels and **Conference Centers are not offering** meeting rooms gratis any longer. Also, a couple of important changes this year is first, the discontinuation of the Pool Tournament due to lack of participation and the return to Oregon Ridge for the Horseshoe, Superstar, and Cornhole competitions. During these events a

cook out featuring hamburgers, hot dogs, and a pig roast will be provided along with soft drinks and legion milk compliments of the Convention Committee. Additionally, there is a \$5.00 reduction for participating in the Bowling and Cornhole Tournaments from \$15.00 to \$10.00 and the Superstar Competition for our youth is free for all members of the Legion Family. As you can see, even though the delegate fees need to increase every effort is being made to reduce fees where feasible and give something back to all those attending the convention.

Legislative Alert

The sequestration began in March and it is too early today to report exactly how those reductions will be made. And please bear in mind these are reductions. No actual cuts to overall government spending will be made by sequestration, only a reduction in the rate of growth of government spending is being made. However, \$85 Billion in across-the-board budget cuts began. Exactly how these reductions will be made and before any federal civilian employee is furloughed the government must first identify those nonessential employees. With the sequestration law military pay and the Department of Veterans Affairs is exempt from sequestration. Other Pentagon accounts will be taking a heavier reduction of funding as that money going for military pay must be made up for somewhere else in the Pentagon's budget. Per testimony from military and civilian Pentagon witnesses it appears the Pentagon will target modernization and readiness accounts for the brunt of these reductions. The American Legion, however, wants no further reductions in Pentagon accounts as it feels this will be a disastrous public policy decision for our national security. Modernization is the purchase of new equipment needed for an uncertain future. Readiness is how we pay to train and equip our military forces now and due to lack of parts and replacement with new equipment and equipment overuse there will more breakdowns of this equipment over time, and lastly, units that remain in home station will not have enough funds for training and supplies to deploy. I am reminding ALL members of the Sons Organization to watch for discussions of Veterans Issues, we need to stand strong in support of our Country and our Veterans.
