LEGISLATIVE REPORT BY BILL STEM

On Tuesday February 2nd members of the Detachment of Maryland attended the Senate hearings on SB-1 (Exemption of Military Retirement benefits from Taxation) and SB-4 (Allowing slots in War Veteran Organizations west of the Bay). Past Detachment Commander Bob Trueblood, Past NCD/SAL Commander Ed Steininger, and DEC/SAL Legislative Commission Chairman Bill Stem attended.

On Thursday, March 18th, members of the Detachment of Maryland traveled to Annapolis to support House Bill #633. This bill would allow slots to be placed in War Veteran Organizations west of the Chesapeake Bay. As it now stands only counties on the east side of the Bay can have these machines.

This Bill sponsored by Delegate Dan Riley would extend that privilege to all counties. Members of the Department of Maryland spoke on the measure and Gary Tennis, SAL Commander from Squadron #95 offered testimony on the benefits that have been accrued from his Post having the machines.

Aside from Commander Tennis, Past Detachment Commander Bob Trueblood, Past NCD/SAL Commander Ed Steininger, present NCD SAL First Vice Al Walls, and DEC/SAL Legislative Commission Chairman Bill Stem also attended the hearings.

As of this writing, neither bill has come before the Legislature.

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NEC NEWS BY ANDY DADDS NATIONAL EXECUTIVE COMMITTEEMEN

I bring you greetings from National Commander Mark Arneson. Commander Arneson has called for the spring NEC meeting in Indianapolis on May 1-2, 2010.

The Detachment officers attending will be taking the National Management Institute classes I, II and III. These classes help our officers to prepare themselves for the task of running the Detachment when they become our Commander. The classes take 3yrs to complete and they are well worth taking. Many of our Past Detachment Commanders have graduated from NMI.

The Eastern Region membership for March 1, 2010 has moved out of last place to 4th place with a percentage rate of 77.770% which is short of the March 10th goal of 80%. The Detachment stands at 79.871% on March 1st and our renewal rate of 72.77%.

Here are some frequently asked

questions:

I am a member of The American Legion. Can I also belong to the Sons?

Yes! Many veterans who are eligible for membership in The American Legion are also eligible to join the Sons. They are very much welcome to belong to both organizations. We call these individuals dual members. They are quite often an important link between the Sons and The American Legion Post in their home towns.

I am moving to a new town and want to transfer my membership there. How do I get a new card?

Be sure to report your new address. You can do that in person through your new Squadron Adjutant, or you can do it electronically by going to The Legion's Web site and filling out an electronic form.

The American Legion offers programs for honorary memberships

and "Paid Up For Life" (PUFL). Does the S.A.L. offer these same membership programs?

Not really. Squadrons that want to honor an individual with an honorary membership must take care of renewing that individual's membership annually. There is no way to pre-pay for future years memberships. Also, there is no program for an individual to make a lump-sum payment that will cover his membership for the rest of his life. In these respects, the Sons are quite different from its parent organization.
