## CRABBIN' FOR MEMBERSHIP BY BUDDY MASTIN

I hope that everyone is out there "Crabbin' For Membership". Make sure your traps, poles and lines are in working order and haul in those crabs (members). And remember, we even keep the small ones. The goal of each crabber (district) is to have a full pot of crabs (members). The contest to fill your pots with members will be based on percentage as posted on the last Friday of each month started in August and ends in May. The District with the highest percentage will get 7 points, 2nd place 6 points, 3rd place 5 points, 4th place 4 points, 5th/6th/7th places 3 points each. The first crew to have zero goose eggs will get 3 bonus points. And, the first District to reach 100% will get 3 bonus points. The winning District will get a bushel of crabs. As of March 1st, Southeastern Shore is in 1<sup>st</sup> place with 52 points and Northern Central is in 2<sup>nd</sup> place with 36 points. Make sure your pots and nets are in good shape and no crabs (members) get out of your pots. Thank you to all the Squadrons who have sent in membership lately. On the National Report we are in 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the East. We are at 85.2% and getting close to the 90% target date. With your help we can make it. *All*

**Convention Package:** Every squadron has now received two copies of the Convention Information & Registration Forms, Ad Sales, Detachment Forms, and Consolidated Report Form Training packages. Additionally, every Squadron Commander has received

their official 2011 Consolidated Report Form for their squadron. All Detachment Forms, the Consolidated Report Form, and Convention Registration Forms and monies are due back on May 27, 2011. The May 27<sup>th</sup> date is also the official cut-off date for all Detachment Awards which will be given out during the Convention session.

**Administrative Check List:** This is a busy time of year for each of us as our administrative term comes to an end and I want to remind everyone on some actions that are time sensitive. If you have a candidate for Detachment office get those endorsement letters completed at the appropriate levels and sent to me for recording. As squadron elections take place, Squadron Certification forms need to be updated and sent in and don't forget to give your District Commander a list of names of those that plan to attend the National Convention in Minneapolis, Minn. Remember, two actions must be completed before you can pick up your 2012 squadron membership cards at this Detachment Convention. First, your squadron delegate fees

must be paid in accordance with the delegate criteria listed in your Convention Package and second, your Squadron 2011-2012 Certification Form must be completed and received. On the district level a Certification Form must be filled out for the newly elected Commander and Adjutant and a list of Detachment Executive Committeemen for the 2011-2012 administrative year. These need to be ratified at the Detachment Post Convention D.E.C. meeting.

**Renewal Postcard Mailing:** The next National membership renewal mailing is scheduled for April 2011 which will be the last renewal mailing for the 2011 membership year. As a reminder, these mailings are made in conjunction and subsequent to membership target dates. The next target date is April 13, 2011. Please transmit as many memberships as possible before this date. This saves the organization considerable dollars in unnecessary postage costs.
