The "Membership Cup Race" has rounded the 3<sup>rd</sup> turn of the race and is headed down the straightaway. The lead has changed several times during this race, however one thing has been consistent and that is the drive to keep our membership on track. This will be the last article before our Detachment convention, so please support your "Jockey" (District Commander) and let's bring every District across the 100% line by May 19, 2012.

**Recruit:** Always keep an application with you. As a matter of fact you should have an application for all three (3) organizations of American Legion with you at all times. Chat up the SAL in line at the grocery store or while shopping anywhere, or even at work. You would be surprised as to how many people aren't aware of what the Sons of The American Legion are about, or at the least aware of how much The American Legion does for their local community and this great country. Remind people that The American Legion and its programs (Sons of The American Legion) are more than Baseball, Bingo and Beer. We're a group of individuals who are proud of our "Priceless heritage" and we want them to feel the same pride!

**Renew:** If possible, send out post card size reminders from your squadron to those who haven't renewed and ask them to mail in their dues or drop it off by the post. A personal note is one of the best reminders/persuaders. Or if you have a list of phone numbers distribute the list amongst your membership team and make a few calls. Again the personal touch is always a great way to communicate. Also, use emails or Facebook as a reminder.

**Reinstate:** If you have a member who dropped off because of a personal situation, or if their dues were being paid by a parent or grandparent, find out what you can offer to bring them back. Now let's complete this "Membership Cup Race" with all of the Districts coming across the 100% finish line!

The current membership updates have the Detachment at 86%, which is exceeding our next membership target goal of 80% by March 14<sup>th</sup> and keeps us on "Track" to making our 100% goal by May 19, 2012 and potentially the 105% goal by July 2, 2012. We are 90 members ahead of this time last year. Outstanding job gentlemen!! Keep up the fantastic work.

**Race update:** Going into the straightaway we have a very close race with the *North Eastern Shore* in 1<sup>st</sup> place by .001% over 2<sup>nd</sup> place *South Eastern Shore* (who has lead the race for a few

months) followed by *Western Maryland* in the "Show" position; however all of the remaining district are on pace and will provide an interesting finish to this race. I am positive all of the districts will meet their 100% membership goal.

The final membership standing at the end of May 2012 will place the top three Districts in a Win, Place, or Show position. Remember this is a straight-up race towards the finish line, so keep your eyes on those membership target dates! There are no extra points for "no goose eggs" (although having none will help push you towards the finish line), no weekly or monthly points for being in the lead, and no special consideration for having the largest membership count (bragging rights for this is acceptable though).

Any District Commander who finishes the race with 100% of their membership goal will receive a customized polo shirt, with the wording "Membership Cup Race, 2011 - 2012, 100% Achievement" and, if they reach the 105% goal, the percent will be adjusted to what they achieved and printed in larger letters. District Commanders, I would like nothing more than to present seven (7) shirts at our Convention this year, so please get out there and bring in the members.

One of the best approaches to building those membership numbers is to keep the three R's (Recruit, Retain & Reinstate) of membership in mind at all times. So, I encourage every squadron member to go out and keep the three R's of membership moving and help your District Commander ride that membership horse across the finish line.
