### MEMBERSHIP BY BILL HILL

The "Membership Cup Race" has come to an end and did we have one heck of a race. We set new highs (4-Star) for three (3) Districts and twenty-nine (29) squadrons, along with reaching (3-Star) for twenty-six squadrons. Outstanding!

The final stretch of the membership race appeared to be coming down to a "Photo Finish", but when the South Eastern Shore District took the final strides, they did it in a big way and turned in fifty-nine (59) membership during the last week of the race and gave no doubt as to who came across the finish line in 1<sup>st</sup> Place. Congratulations to the entire NESD and all of the other Districts for a job well done!

#### The final official standings are:

Win - South Eastern Shore District @ 107.2 of goal -(1,403 members)

Place – North Eastern Shore District @ 103.2% of goal – (1,581 members)

Show - Western Maryland District @ 101.13% of goal -(4,821 members)

#### Rounding out the race:

Mountain District @ 98.71% of goal – (612 members)

Southern Maryland District @ 96.39% of goal – (3,632 members)

Northern Central District @ 94.27% of goal – (2,764 members)

Baltimore District @ 80.94% of goal – (293 members)

As you know the program was a straight-up race towards the finish line and from my vantage point it was a great race! There were no extra points for "no goose eggs", no weekly or monthly points for being in the lead, and no special consideration for having the smallest or largest membership count. In the end it came down to a great group of District Commanders leading the way and an equally great group of squadron members supporting them throughout the entire race.

As promised the District Commander(s) who finished the race with 100% of their membership goal will receive a customized polo shirt, with the wording "Membership Cup Race, 2011 – 2012, 100% Achievement" and, if they reach the 105% goal, the percent will be adjusted to what they achieved and printed in larger letters. So, I look forward to presenting these shirts at our annual convention, and please come out and show your support for all of the District Commanders.

Detachment update: We are currently 109 members ahead of this same time last year (15,106) and we're 186 members away from reaching 100%. However; we still have time to reach the final National goal of for this administrative year of 105% by July 26<sup>th.</sup> So let's continue our push for membership and send our Detachment Commander to the National Convention of the Sons of The American Legion, being held in Indianapolis, IN with the additional bragging rights of meeting this goal.
