Child Welfare Foundation

As we approach the \$6 million mark in donations to ALCWF. we must continue to work hard and remember that our children are our future.

In its 58th year, The American Legion Child Welfare Foundation has awarded \$734,220 to 20 nonprofit organizations whose mission is to care for the overall well-being of America's most precious natural resource-children.

The grants were approved during CWF's annual board of directors meeting in Indianapolis on Oct. 14, 2012. The following are two local Maryland firms who were awarded grants and a description of what their funds will be used toward:

CureSearch for Children's Cancer of

Bethesda, Md., funds and supports children's cancer research, and provides resources to all those impacted. The organization was awarded \$25,500 for its project, "Childhood Cancer Care for the Whole Patient: CureSearch Webinar Series." This grant will provide funding for three webinar programs to help families manage the psychosocial aspects for having a child with cancer. The Sons of The American Legion sponsored this grant.

Immune Deficiency Foundation of

Towson, Md., provides accurate information to those who have been diagnosed with a primary immunodeficiency disease. The organization was awarded \$48,500 for its project, "The Little Zebra – A Children's Storybook." The grant will produce an illustrated children's storybook that will

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help explain primary immunodeficiency disease to a child or his or her peers. The American Legion Auxiliary sponsored this grant.

The Department of Veterans Affairs has reached another milestone in its disability claims transformation process - over 30 percent of the current disability claims inventory is now digital and accessible to claim raters in VA's electronic claims processing system, which has now been fielded ahead of schedule at all 56 Regional Offices across the country. This effort is a key part of transforming outdated paper processing into an electronic system that is delivering disability claims decisions for Veterans more quickly. In addition, all incoming paper claims are transformed into digital records for electronic processing using VA's new claims processing software and electronic repository.

New Benefit Takes Effect August 6 for First-Time Filers The Department of Veterans Affairs announced today [August 1, 2013] that Veterans filing an original Fully Developed Claim (FDC) for service-connected disability compensation may be entitled to up to one-year of retroactive disability benefits. The retroactive benefits, which are in effect Aug. 6, 2013, through Aug. 5, 2015, are a result of a comprehensive legislative package passed by Congress and signed into law by President Obama (Continued from page 4)
