We discussed the definition of Membership in our first newsletter and now I want to discuss the definition of team. What is the Definition of Team?

We are all a team of the great organization The Sons of The American Legion. The membership is the lifeblood of our organization. Just like our theme this year "Baseball" We are all a baseball team and we are all "Making a Pitch for Membership"

My 1st goal is to get more of our younger members involved. I would like to see 50 Junior members at our convention this year. Let's get those young members that we all have and let's get them involved. The 1st push was to go to The American Legion & Auxiliary Meetings and get dual members and grandsons joined up.

The 2nd thing I want our Squadron Commanders to do is to attend a Boy Scout or Cub Scout Meeting at your post or one of the Scout troops or Cub Packs that your Squadron or Post support. Then ask all the Boy Scouts or Cub Scouts if their father or grandfather served in the Military and if they did please hand them an application. I have done this in our Squadron and it has gotten us 5 new members.

This is a great way to obtain new and younger members that can and possibly attend our convention this year.

Right now we are 301 members behind from last year. That is a large number and I would like to see us get those renewals in and get caught up to last year and by our Meeting on the 22nd of November I would like to be ahead of last year. Let's clear the benches and hit some home runs and stay away from those sinkers.

Out of our seven districts, North Central District is in 1st place and has ZERO goose eggs. In second place is North Eastern Shore district with ZERO goose eggs. In 3rd place is South Eastern Shore District with only 1 goose egg. Southern Maryland is in 4th place with 3 goose eggs. Baltimore District is in 5th with 1 goose egg and they did score some runs and met and exceeded the November 13th goal. 6the place is Mountain district with 2 goose eggs and Western Maryland is bringing up the rear with only 1 goose egg. I heard that Western Maryland is changing up the lineup and will be caught up very shortly.

We are now in the 3rd inning. November 13th is our next goal which is 35%. We have 5 districts that have already reached that goal. Northern Central, North Eastern Shore & South Eastern Shore Districts have already exceeded our December 10th Goal of 45%. They have been hitting some Grand Slams, Excellent job to those 3 districts, way to make that Pitch for Membership. We still have 2 districts that have not reached the goal but they have another week to do, so that change up is just what Mountain district may need as they are just 2.41% away and Western

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Maryland district which is just 2.89% away from our goal.

Overall we are at 42.08% which is great. Thanks to all the hard work that the district commanders and squadron commanders have done to meet and exceed our goals. However, we still have 33 squadrons out of 111 that still have to reach that 35% goal, but there is still time to reach it as we have another week. Let's get running those bases and get those membership renewals home.

For the District Commanders I will be holding monthly membership calls on the 3rd Wednesday of the month, you will be receiving an email prior to each call. The first call will be held on Wednesday November 19th at 7:00 PM and if you have a Squadron Commander that would like to attend please feel free to give him the information. Our first call will be prior to our second DEC meeting which will be on Saturday November 22nd. After the meeting there will be a drawdown and then Karaoke to follow into the evening. If you want to get a room at the Hampton Inn they are charging 115.95 a room. Just ask for the SAL block to reserve a room.

I am looking forward having and serving with everyone to have a great year.

Flag Replacement Program:

Do you have a Flag Replacement program in your Post? This is a worthwhile program that your squadron should consider implementing in your Post. Implementing the Flag Replacement program in your Post is easy to do. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me, information is at the bottom of the page.

This is a program whereby flags in the community that are worn, torn or faded can be replaced by new flags. Squadrons can advertise in their communities that old flags can be brought to their Post and be replaced with a new flag. The person bringing in the flag must complete in full a Flag Replacement form. That is for every flag that is replaced a form must be completed. For example, if a person requested five flags, five replacement forms need to be completed.

Squadrons can sponsor fundraisers in their Post to raise monies to buy flags. Squadrons can purchase American flags at all Detachment meetings. Remember, Veteran's Day is fast approaching and your squadron can place flags on the graves of veterans in your communities.

Awards will be given to the two top squadrons who have replaced the most flags. That is, same rules apply as last year. Please make sure you indicate on the form, the size of the flag. Five points will awarded for 3x5 flags and smaller flags will count for 1 point. Again, the Flag Replacement form must be completed with each flag given out. Replacement forms will be available at all Detachments meetings as well as flags. Also, you can download the form on-line under Americanism at the bottom of the page. Stats from 2014 Maryland Boys State Program

193 boys graduated from program this year that is up from 174 in 2013, 173 in 2012, and 156 in 2011. -- 66 posts sent money in to support boys this year. -- No businesses donated directly to Boys State at the Dept level. Post 282 collected donations from 3 local businesses to sponsor the 12 boys they sent to Boys State. -- 73 posts, counties, and districts sent applications to Boys State. One from Germany and one from DC are included in these numbers.

Sr. Senator Jeremy Price was sponsored by Carroll Post 31 in Westminster and attends Westminster HS. Jr. Senator Miles Walker was sponsored by Post 194 in Rising Sun. He was recruited by Post 300. He attends Atholton HS. Governor Maurice Harris was sponsored by Post 275 in Glenarden and attends Surratsville HS.

Canine therapy dogs have been around for years and often comfort patient's in hospitals with their unconditional love. As an extension to that mission, the Josh and friends Project emerged by introducing children to the book "I'll Be OK" and a cuddly stuffed animal named Josh. The goal was to help children with the overwhelming anxiety of a hospital stay. The GI Josh program started as a connection between the Detachment of Arizona, Sons of The American Legion. The Child Welfare Foundation (CWF) and Josh Dogs group. This was created to bring some level of comfort to children of deployed service personal. Children struggle with separation issues when parents are deployed and the whole "I'll Be OK" piece is helpful here as well. Children do learn coping mechanisms and skills through the story/book that features Josh and his friend Smudge. We encourage all squadrons to pick up the challenge and purchase a Josh Dog to give out at nearby children's hospital or purchase a GI Josh Dog and get it to a deployed military member's child.
