Right now we are 109 members behind from last year. Here we are in the 5th inning heading towards the goal of 60%. I know when we are at our meeting in January all our districts will have made that goal and will be heading to the 6th inning towards the February 11th goal of 75%. At the Meeting I will be bringing up a new challenge to all the districts and this will be something new for most of the districts.

Flag Replacement Program:

Do you have a Flag Replacement program in your Post? This is a worthwhile program that your squadron should consider implementing in your Post. Implementing the Flag Replacement program in your Post is easy to do. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me, information is at the bottom of the page.

This is a program whereby flags in the community that are worn, torn or faded can be replaced by new flags. Squadrons can advertise in their communities that old flags can be brought to their Post and be replaced with a new flag. The person bringing in the flag must complete in full a Flag Replacement form. That is, for every flag that is replaced a form must be completed. For example, if a person requested five flags, five replacement forms need to be completed.

Awards will be given to the two top squadrons who have replaced the most flags. That is, same rules apply as last year. Please make sure you indicate on the form, the size of the flag. Five points will awarded for 3x5 flags and smaller flags will count for 1 point. Again, the Flag Replacement form must be

completed with each flag given out. Replacement forms will be available at all Detachments meetings, as well as, flags. Also, you can down load the form on-line under Americanism at the bottom of the page.
